Introduction

Keithcot Farm Children's Centre for Early Childhood Development and Parenting is an integrated early childhood service in which Early Childhood Educators, Allied Health, Community Development Professionals, families and the local community - work together to meet the needs of families and children.

We offer the State Funded Preschool Program integrated with the Commonwealth funded Long Day Care for children from birth to school entry. Keithcot Farm Children's Centre is co-located with Keithcot Farm Primary School and Kings Baptist Grammar School at 5 Keithcot Farm Drive, Wynn Vale. The Centre is part of the Golden Way Partnership of the Department for Education and Child Development and located within the Northern Community Team Health Service and the state-wide Child and Youth Health Service.

Curriculum

We use the national Early Years Learning Framework as the basis for planning, monitoring and reporting on children's learning. Our children's learning program is child oriented and play based within a high quality learning environment that integrates all aspects of children's learning in a holistic approach.

Play is the central mode of learning and the experiences provided and developed contribute to the achievement of successful learning outcomes for all children, particularly in the areas of literacy and numeracy.

We provide accessible and equitable high quality learning and care programs for children and connect with a range of health and community based services and programs. Our visiting and transition program to Keithcot Farm School provides ongoing continuity of learning for children into the first years of school.

Facilities and Children's Learning Environment

Keithcot Farm is a modern facility with integrated child care and preschool facilities, co-located with Keithcot Farm Primary School.

The outdoor learning environment is supportive of children's needs and there are undercover areas and shade from maturing trees.

The building is air-conditioned. Car parking facilities are minimal.

We are licensed for 92 children (including 15 children under 2) at any one time and have access for children and staff with disabilities.

The Centre is owned by the Department for Education and Child Development.

Centre Operations

Keithcot Farm Children's Centre Governing Council has oversight of the strategic directions of the Centre, the financial management of the Centre and the employment of childcare staff.

Centre Staff work with the Governing Council and have oversight of the daily operations and management of the centre programs and services. Volunteers are encouraged to support the programs and services of the Centre and to contribute to the decisions made about the Centre.

Local Community

General characteristics include:

- 12% housing trust throughout Golden Grove development
- a significant number of two income families who rely on child care
- Local primary schools and high schools
- Golden Grove Village Shopping Centre, Recreation Centre, and Sunnybrook Medical Centre.
- Commercial/industrial zone
