



BETWEEN SESSION CARE PROGRAM NQS 1.1.3 Version 1.12

The fee for Between Session Care is set by the Governing Council and is reviewed, at least annually. This program is provided in addition to the child's eligible entitlement of 15 hours of Preschool per week. To access this program, it is a requirement at enrolment that families sign the Direct Debit form. If families wish to claim the Child Care Benefit and / or Child Care Rebate, they need to register with the Family Assistance Office. The parent / guardian who receive the Family Tax Benefit will also need to provide their date of birth, Customer Registration Number and that of their child to the Children's Centre. Between Session Care will be charged regardless of attendance (ie sickness or family holiday, but not for Public Holidays) during school terms. Commonwealth Government rebates are not provided for children who are not immunised.

FEES ARE TO BE PAID ON A WEEKLY BASIS, VIA DIRECT DEBIT. If, at any time, a Direct Debit request is rejected, families will be contacted. Fees must be paid to date.

The Between Session Care program takes into account:

- Staffing
- Environment
- Children's developmental level in regard to their self- help skills
- Diagnosed dietary needs / food allergies / cultural considerations
- Social development of children in regards to positive discussions around nutrition and food
- Choice of a Relaxation / Yoga session

The Between Session Care runs Monday to Friday during school terms for eligible children, with a priority for children who access the long day care program. Where there are **vacancies**, children enrolled in the sessional preschool program may access places in the Between Session Care program. There will be a priority of access to this program based on Commonwealth Government Guidelines regarding entitlement to Child Care Benefit and / or Child Care Rebate. Access to the Between Session Care Program **must** be negotiated with the Director / Assistant Director as places are limited.

Parents whose children have diagnosed medical food allergies must have a Modified Diet plan completed by a doctor at least one week before the child commences at the Centre. They will have their photo and relevant details recorded and stored confidentially. If for cultural reasons children are required to have a modified diet, they will also have relevant details recorded and stored confidentially. Parents must discuss these requirements with our Director and / or Cook one week prior to the child accessing the program, to enable a modification to the menu to meet the child's needs. Other modifications are not practical due to the large numbers. Parents of children who have "fussy eating habits" are advised to discuss their concerns with the Director **prior to enrolling** in the program. Programs to support parents of children who have "fussy eating habits", will be made available by our Community Development Co-ordinator and Allied Health staff on a needs basis.
